- Develop a detailed project plan to monitor progress and revise as appropriate to meet changing needs and requirements;
- Manage and execute details of projects and programs, keeping the team aligned and on track with project goals and vision;
- Set deadlines, assign responsibilities and monitor and summarize progress of project;
- Develop and maintain positive working relationships with team members, partners and other stakeholders—during and after project completion;
- Develop and support execution of talking points and media strategy;
- Provide support to all iACT team members;
- Manage outreach for and inventory of project, program, campaign, and event items, equipment, and gear;
- Create messaging and outreach plans for campaigns and events and execute on plans;

- Ensure the timely and effective delivery of campaigns, events, and services with quality and within the agreed upon budget;
- Maintain an overview of past projects, coordinate regular follow-up for quality assurance and to maintain relationships;
- Contribute to fundraising initiatives, including digital media campaigns and events; and
- Represent iACT at community events.
